## \*\*Civic Engagement Hours\*\*

Complete 50 hours of voluntary participation in community service or extracurricular activities during the student's high school career (participation can be counted starting the summer prior to 9th grade). Of the required service hours, a minimum of 15 hours must be obtained participating in civic engagement

**NOTE:** Any student who enlists the United States Military prior to graduation will be deemed to meet Criteria 3.
